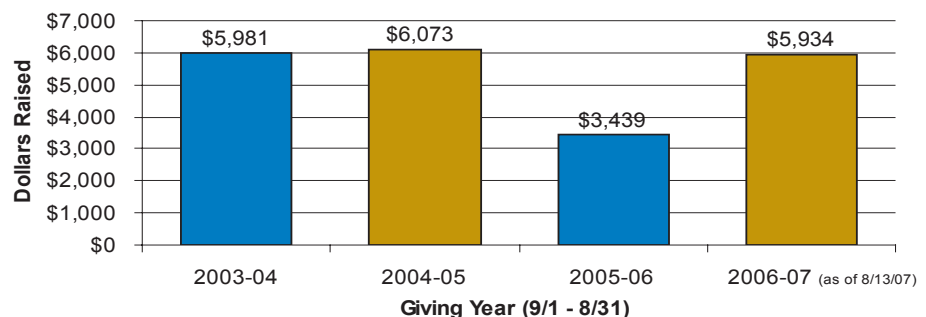
2006-07 Annual Fund: How Did We Measure Up?

Colony Representative Learns Valuable Lessons at ZBT's National Convention

Rising sophomore **Joshua Styles** represented the Xi Colony at this year's national convention, held July 13-17 in Philadelphia, Pa. He shares with us what he learned at the convention and how he'll apply this knowledge to the Xi Colony.

What were some of the key points you learned from the convention?

Some key points I learned were rush strategies, popular philanthropy projects, new places to look for community service projects, some innovative ways to incorporate brotherhood involvement into brotherhood education, and ways to improve the academic standing of the overall colony/Chapter.
