




MEMBER UPDATE

could have a backyard again and we could have more space after living in a 750 square foot apartment for 2 years.




Being a Zebe taught me a lot about how to be a good leader and connect with people to achieve a common goal. I think it also taught me a lot about tolerance, being crammed in
